SPECIAL T TOOLS

This month's tool is a rear axle bearing sleeve remover that was available from Ford dealers back in the 1920's. The picture on the left shows a lever at the top right which activates a cammed plug into the hole in the sleeve. Once the sleeve is captured, the sleeve is removed by turning the crank against the axle as shown in the picture on the right This special tool makes quick work of removing bearing sleeves. NEAT!

Old Business: Excess tour monies from the overnighter will be refunded to each participant. Please see Jeannine Clary if


you have not received your refund. Bill Newlin has not been able to check with our insurance carrier about the Brass on the Grass car show and the possibility of giving children rides in our Model T's.


