



**New Business:** 35 th anniversary celebration tour was mentioned and will be addressed very soon.





#### 1914 MODEL T FORD TOURING CAR

For sale is a true to original brass era 1914 Model T that was lovingly rebuilt by my father from the wheels up over a period spanning 1960-1990. It now needs to find a new home as I am moving from Healdsburg.

The car starts (crank only), and runs very well, and has some unique touches to complement the original look: brass highlights on the wheels and steering wheel as well as a custom hand-made dash board and hand-formed brass coil box. The acetylene headlights, and oil side lights and taillight are a matched set manufactured by E & J. The wood spokes were hand turned, shaped and varnished, with all tires sized  $30 \times 3-1/2$ . The oak wood frame and steel body are rebuilt as original. The engine was completely rebuilt in the 1970s and has a recently rebuilt Bosch magneto bypassing the original coils and distributor for totally reliable ignition. The transmission was rebuilt six years ago and feeds power to a two-speed Ruckstell differential. The upholstery is in the original diamond button-tufted pattern.

The car is a real head turner. Asking price: \$20,000. Extensive photos available on request.
